Dringhouses Primary School KS1 Autumn 1 Learning Project: Superheroes!

Key Questions: How have comic books and superheroes changed over time? What does a superhero look like? Who are our superheroes?

English Links: e.g. Class Novel / Cross-curricular Writing: Supertato, Traction Man, study into Neil Armstrong being a hero and 50 years since the moon landing. Exploring comic books – old and new and making comparisons.

Science

Content: KS1 to have a superhero science week (Week 8) – what makes a superhero? – designing superheroes focussing on the importance of healthy lifestyles Superhero materials investigations.

Skills: Animals (including humans)

- identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

- distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made
- identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock
- describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials
- compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.
