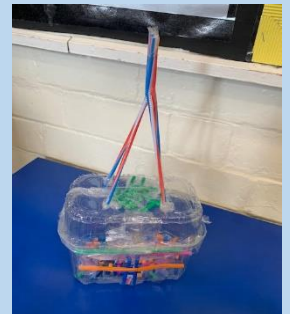
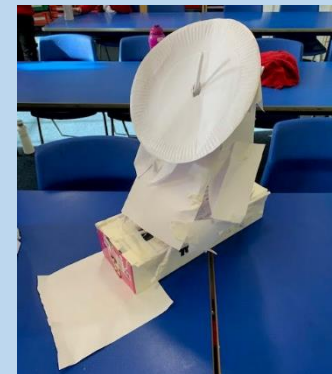
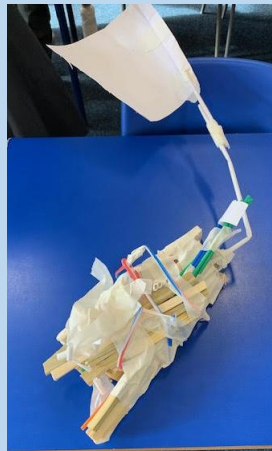
Who's been eating my porridge?

Class 5 – The Three Little Pigs

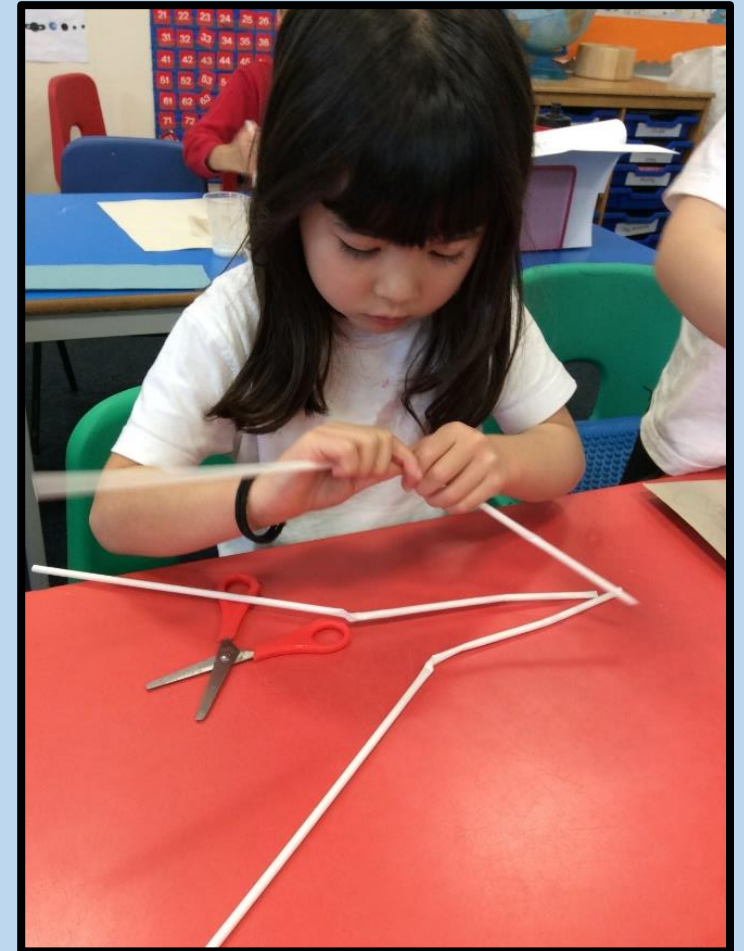

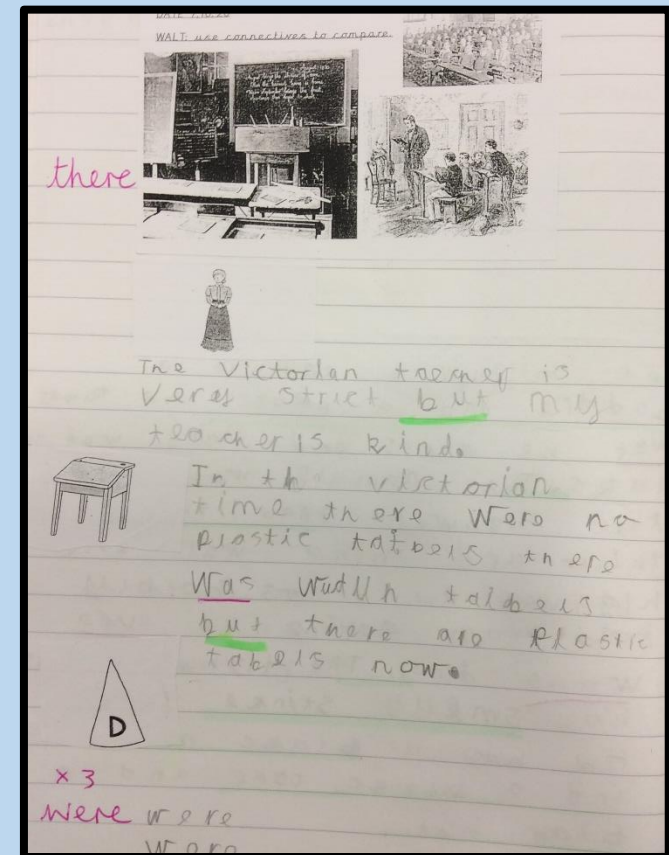
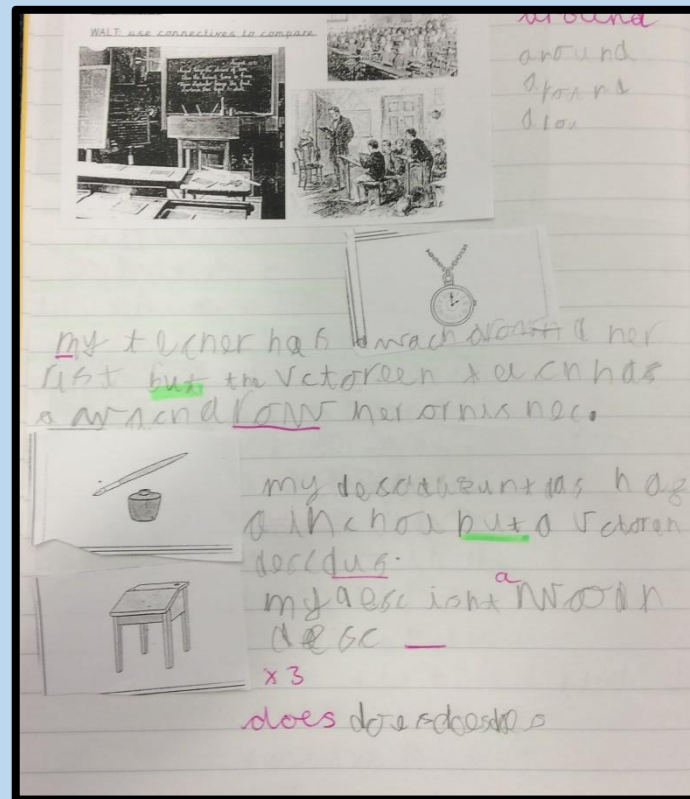
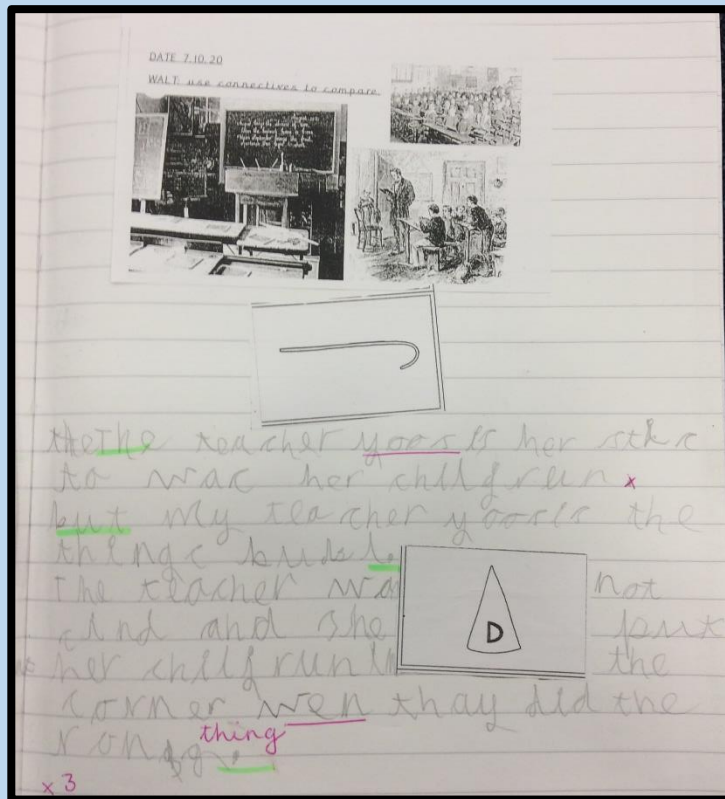
The Three Little Pigs –The House of Straw

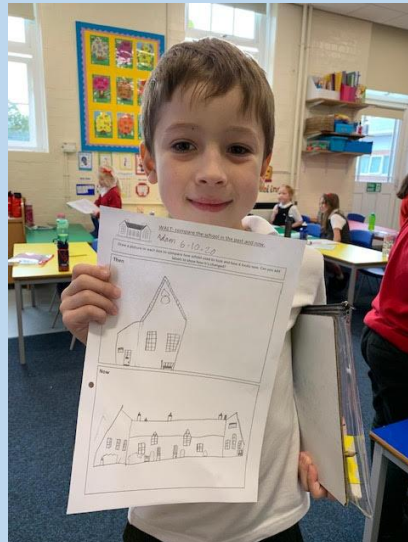
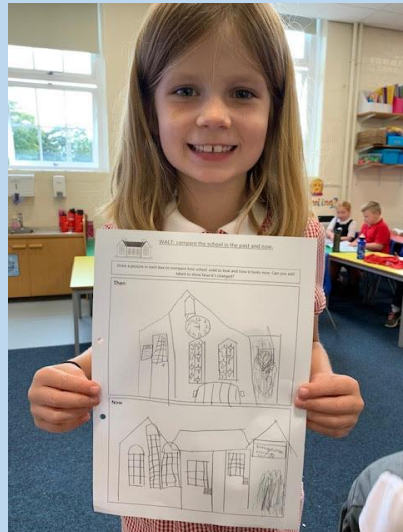
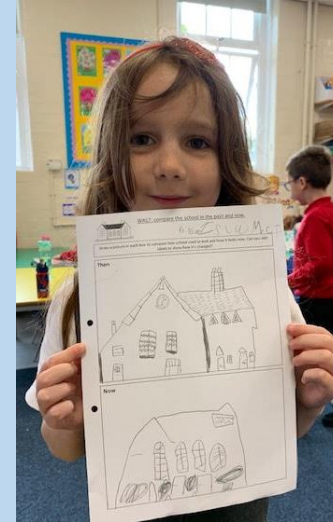
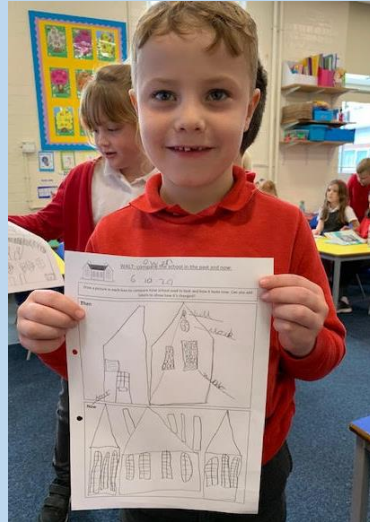
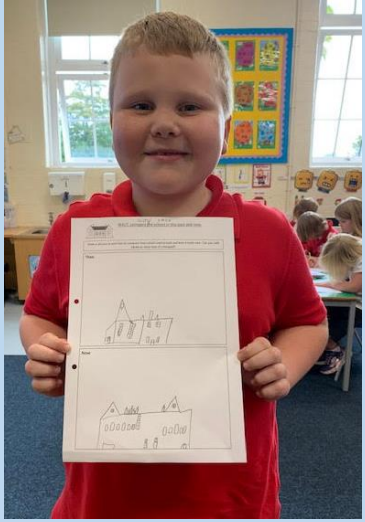
Dear Diary,

Class 5 – The Library and The School



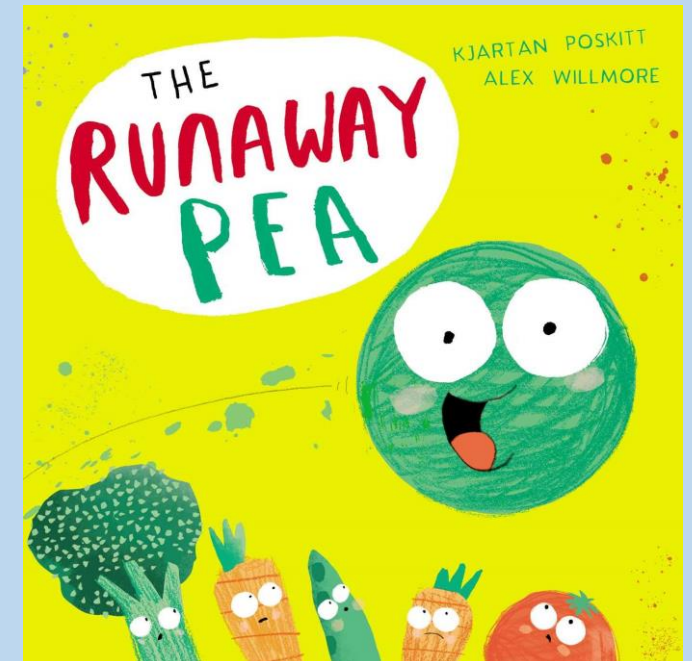
We enjoyed learning about Victorian schools and what life would have been like.

Presents from the library

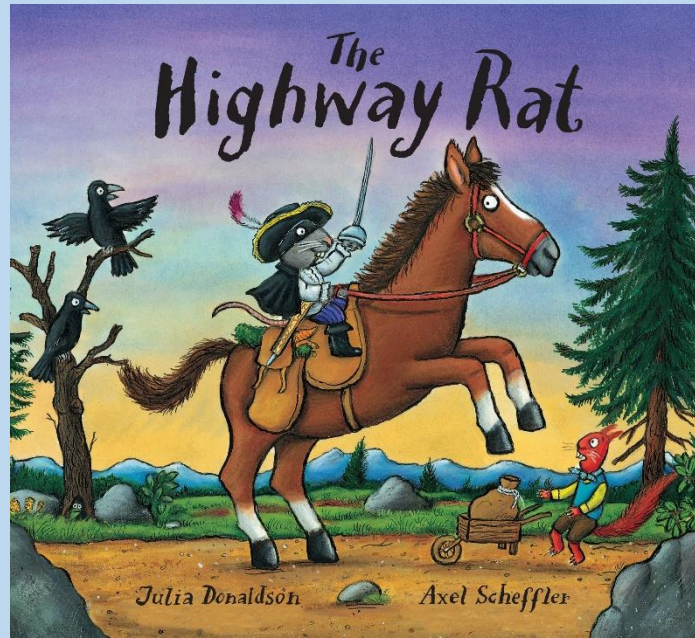

The Highway Rat was a baddie the Highway Rat was a beast.....



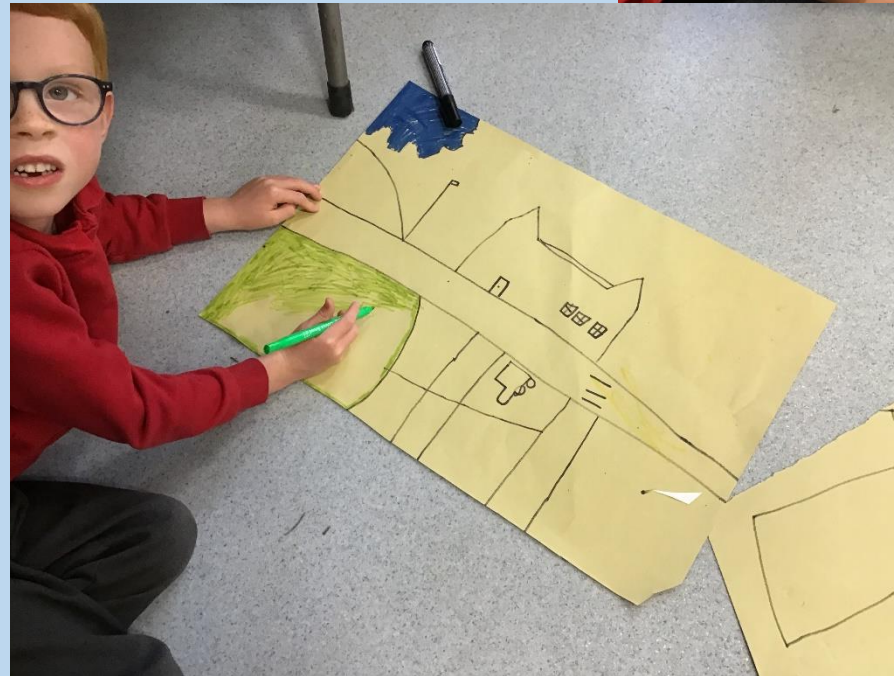
Class 4 – Maps and Beebots



We really enjoyed making maps of our local area as part of our Geography lessons.

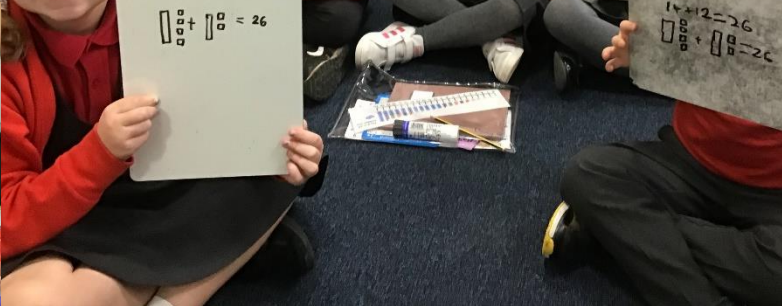
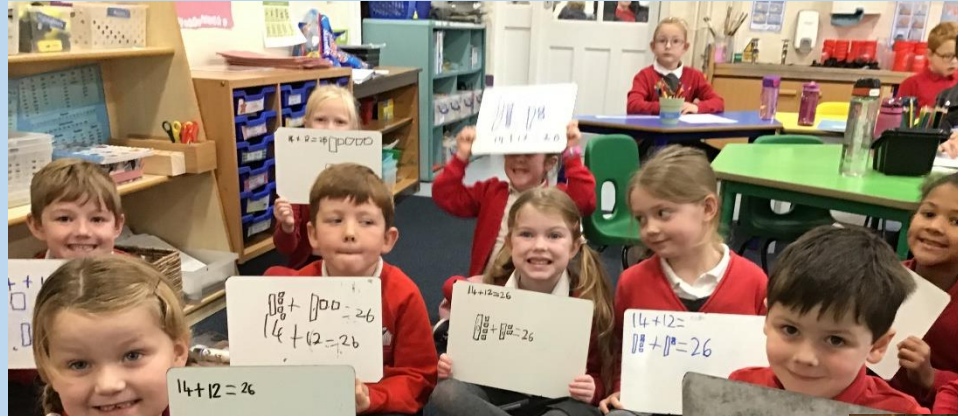
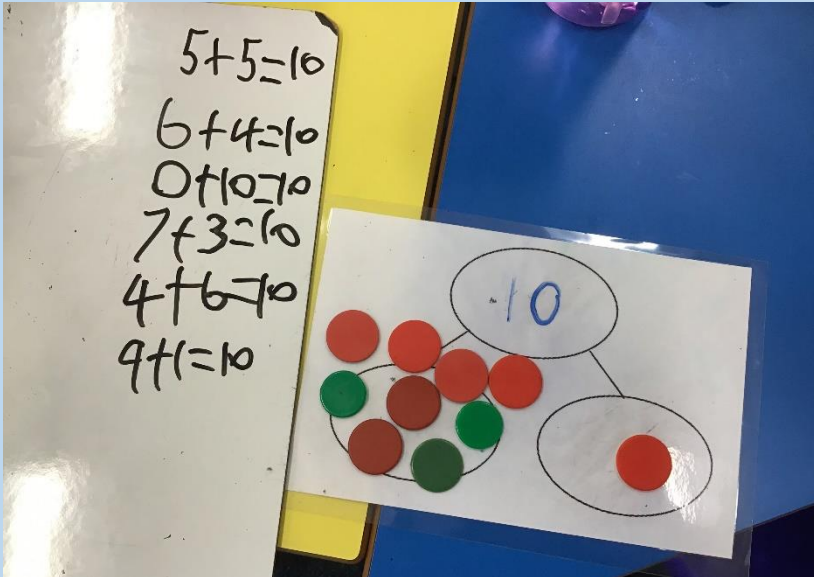


We then decided to combine this with a bit of computing and gave the Beebots instructions to navigate their way around our maps!

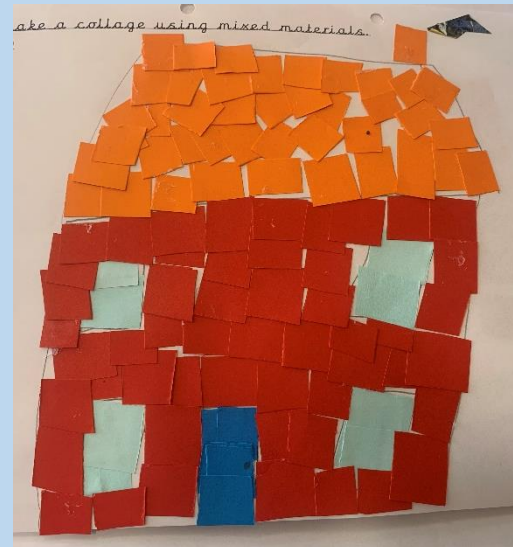


Class 4 -PE

Class 5 – 'My House' Collages



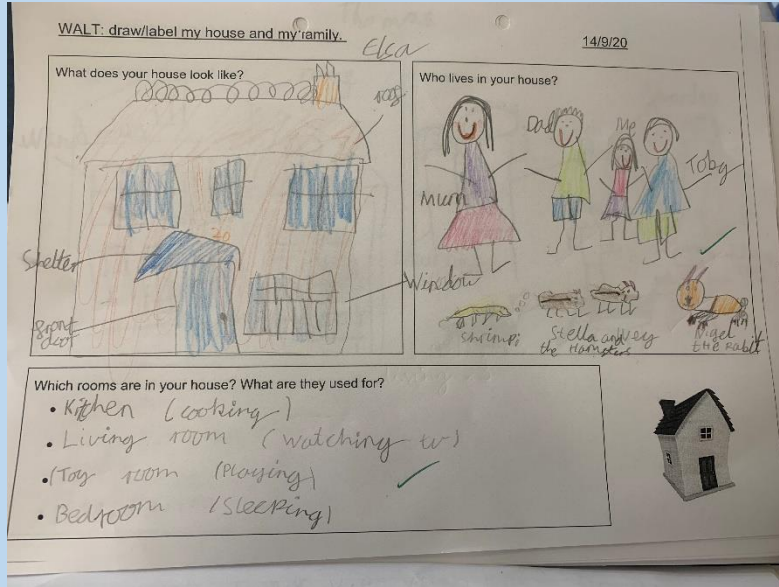
In science, we have been learning about different materials and their properties. In art, we made collages of our own houses using different colours and textures of paper.

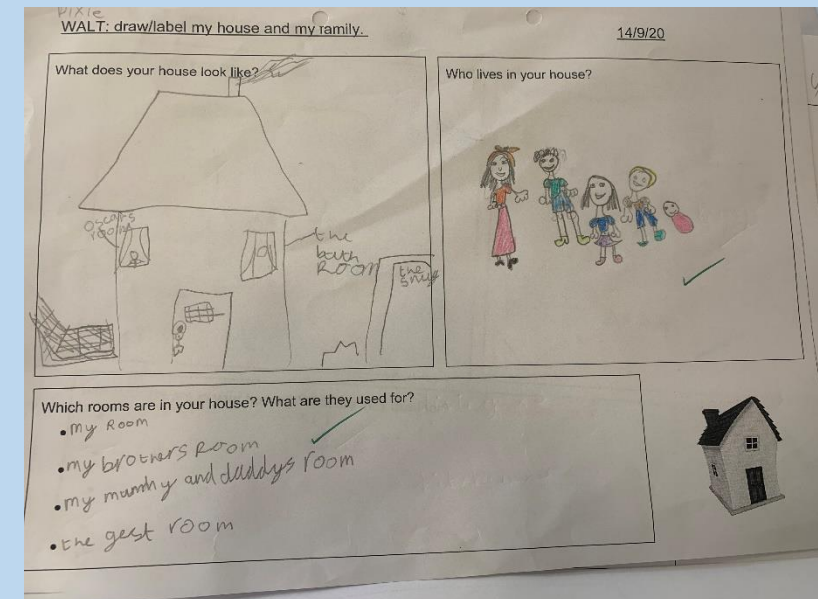
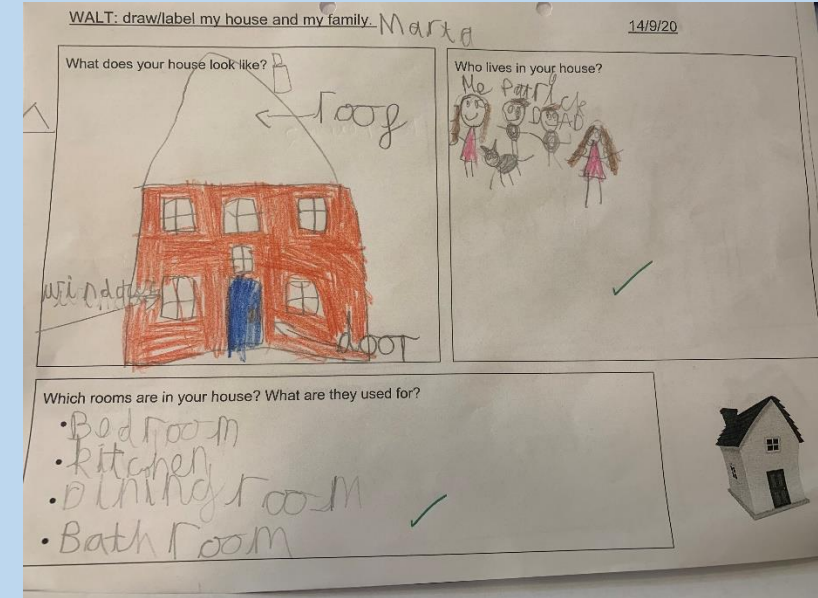
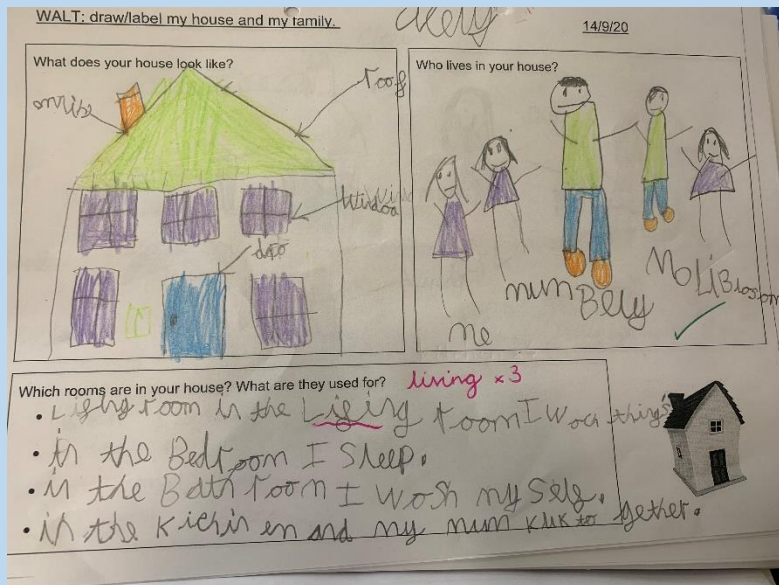
In Art we have been learning to collage – here are some of our collage houses.
