You'll have seen the numbers in the summaries, but I did want to pick up on a few points - three, to be exact.

1. STAFF

If you listened to those esteemed leaders in government, you'd be forgiven for thinking that Covid has all but disappeared.

However, delving a little further into **the covid case numbers for Dringhouses (972 per 100,000)** and for York (891 per 100,000), and the case rates for schools in York more generally, you can see the need for continued vigilance and continued assessment of any risks that face yourselves at home, and on our part in school.

It might be convenient for Covid to have been battled and won as a distraction from a couple of other things going on in government at the minute, but we're not there yet, as our colleagues in Public Health continue to tell us.

As it stands, the isolations at school, and the year-group phase bubbling appears to have stemmed the increase in numbers (although I say that with caution!).

We'll keep you posted and hope to report a further drop over the coming days.

I love an opportunity to thank our community - you, your households, our wider community, - and in the same way that staff being consistently fab means that it can be harder to notice at times, the same goes for the strength and support of you all at home.

Some of our team have been calling home-learners this week, and the conversations that they've had have been so positive, kind, and supportive.

However home-learning feels like it's going (I'm isolating with my 2 year old, and I have NO idea how any of you did it for such long periods over the last couple of years...How much Zog is too much Zog? When does ice-cream stop counting as all of the food groups? Do dogs with little legs get enough exercise if you hold them in the air and let their legs walk as if on a treadmill?), you're doing a great job.
