


Class 4 – 'We're going on a lion hunt' stories

One of our highlights of this half term was writing our very own versions of the story 'We're going on a lion hunt'.



Class 4- spending time outdoors


When the weather has allowed, we have tried to spend lots of quality time outdoors, enjoying the fresh air, playing with our classmates and even having a well deserved ice lolly.












After reading the story of Meerkat Mail, we wrote our own character descriptions for the main character Sonny.

Class 5 – Tinga Tinga Art







Class 5 – Food Chains
