


Hello!








Plans for World Book Day at Dringhouses Primary School!




Why not get a heads start in your learning?

After the holiday each phase will be starting a new learning project. Why not get ahead by reading some of these fantastic books in preparation?


Reception – Who's afraid of the Big Bad Wolf?








Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) — The Jungle Run







Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) — Going on Safari
