

Pyramid	A large structure with a square or triangular base and four triangular sides, used as a burial site for pharaohs.		
Mummy	A preserved body, typically wrapped in linen bandages, as mummified in ancient Egypt.		
Hieroglyphics	Ancient Egyptian writing system using pictorial symbols to represent sounds, words, and ideas

Ancient Egyptians believed in various gods and goddesses, such as Ra (sun god), Osiris (god of the afterlife), Isis (goddess of magic), and Horus (god of kingship). 2. The Great Pyramid of Giza was the tallest man-made structure in the world for over 3,800 years. 3. Ancient Egyptians invented toothpaste, using a mixture of crushed eggshells and pumice. 4.
