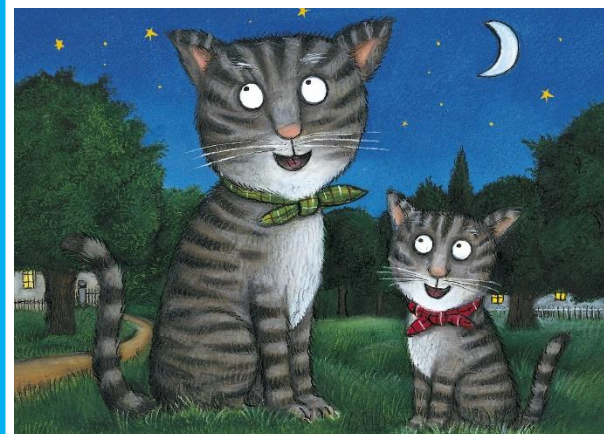

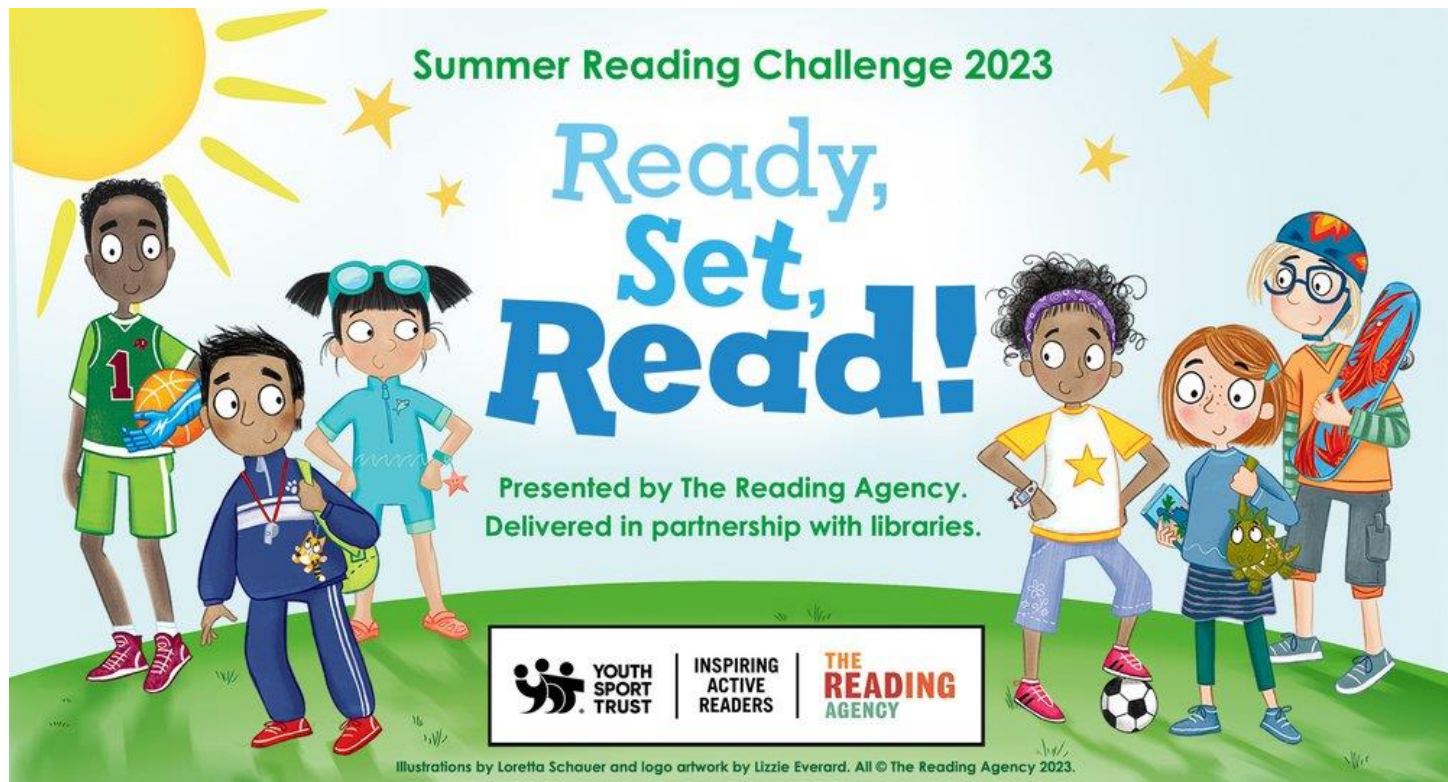


Christmas announcement!

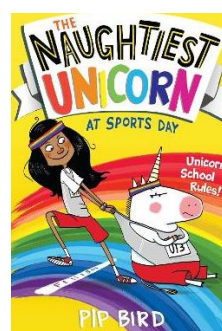
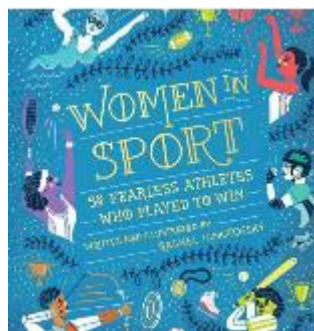
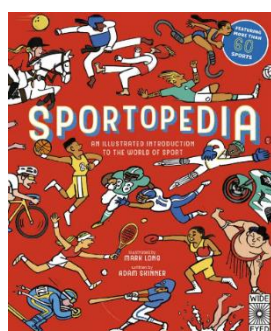
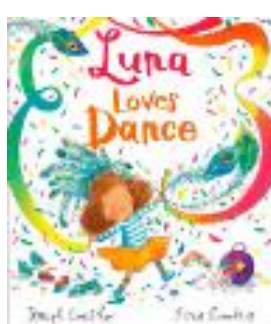
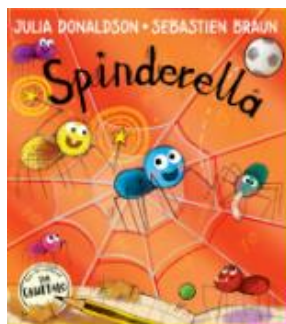
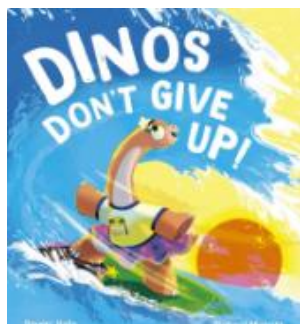

They are a great series, really funny and good for summer reading. If you like comics, you'll like these books.

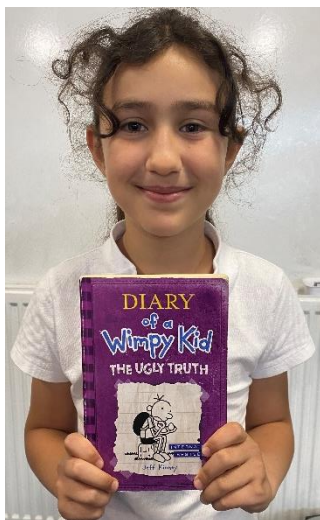


Names: Elliot and Sam

There are lots of books in the series so you'll have lots to read over summer. I like them because they are really funny!



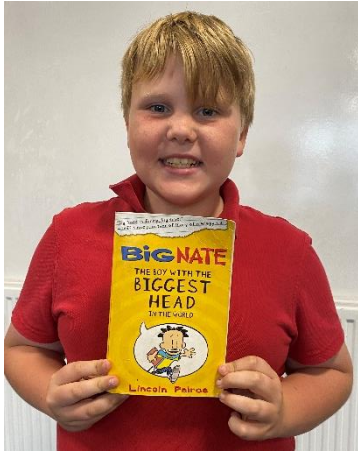

Lots of people enjoy gaming and they might do lots of gaming over summer. Minecraft books will help you get better and you can learn how to build dragons!

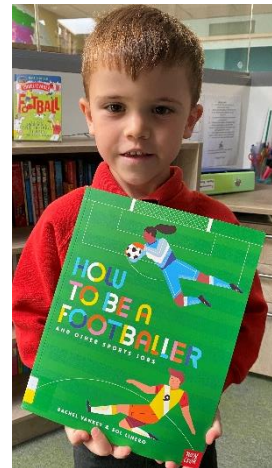


Name: Florence
