


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SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

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


EYFS



Choir begins this Friday, 3.15–4.00pm for anyone in KS2 who enjoys singing.



NSPCC NUMBER DAY



We are delighted to be supporting the NSPCC by taking part in **Number Day on Wednesday 31st January 2024**. Everything the NSPCC does protects children today and prevents abuse tomorrow but the NSPCC needs our support more than ever. By raising money, we can help to fund their vital services such as Childline. On average, a child contacts Childline every 25 seconds.

Number Day is a great way to make maths fun and bring about a positive, 'can-do' attitude towards it. We are taking on a whole school book study project where each class will link their maths learning to the text '365 Penguins' by Jean-Luc Fromental.

We are taking part in some fun maths activities and will be **dressing up in black and white (penguin style!)**. To help raise money for the NSPCC, we are asking for a **suggested donation of £1**, and we'd love everyone in the school to take part in this special event.



WE'RE LISTENING....

Before Christmas we sent out a parents/carers questionnaire. Thank you to all of you who took the time to respond and share your thoughts and opinions. I have shared all of the positives and strengths with staff and it was very much appreciated. It is also important for us as a school to continue to listen and evolve and ensure that everyone in the school community feels happy, safe and valued.

Parking

A few of you raised concerns around the safety of children and families because of parking outside of school. This is what has happened as a result:

- only blue badge holders are permitted to park outside of the school building
- increased SLT and site manager monitoring of improper parking
- the gate to the car park opposite of school will be locked from 8:24-8:45 and 3-3:30. On-street parking and free parking in the Cross Keys car park are both available.
- road safety addressed in whole school assemblies as well as discussions in classes
- the school gate will be opened 5 minutes before the end of clubs such as choir and sports club to allow for families to wait in the sensory garden to collect children from the main entrance as opposed to the street/road outside of school
- all of this information was shared via email on Monday 8th January. If other relatives or family friends also drop off and pick up your child from school, please can you pass this information on to them as well. We are happy to resend the email or provide you with a paper copy if needed.

Communication

- In the weekly newsletter, dates for the half term will always be displayed on the front page so that families can stay more easily informed about what is happening and when. By always being on the front page, it will hopefully give a quick access point for this information. The newsletter will be emailed on a Friday so please ensure that the office has your up to date details. Alternatively, if you would like a paper copy then please request one from the office.
- The notice board at the front of school, near the main entrance, will become a community notice board. This will mean that news, events and competitions happening in the local area can be shared without the number of emails being shared or the length of communication from school becoming overwhelming.

The SLT team and I will continue to discuss and action other points raised throughout the term.
