A fitting end to the topic 'What's in the Sky?' Early Years children enjoyed learning about birds of prey on Monday when York Bird of Prey Centre came to visit. We learnt about what birds of prey eat and how they catch their prey using either their talons or their beak. We also discovered that they see through a squared system which helps them spot prey and that their ears are not at the same height on either side of their heads. We were able to hold a transformer owl – it can place its feathers in a fan shape to give the impression it is bigger than it is, and a barn owl. And finally we were given a demonstration of how they fly.







LKS2 RIVER WALK




Norah from Class 8 has written an absolutely alternative ending this week linked to their story of "Journey to the River Sea". Below is an extract from her super writing:
