














## CLASS 1 & 2 – Where in the world do you live?

<b>globe</b>	a model of the Earth.		
<b>atlas</b>	a book of maps or charts.		
<b>country</b>	an area of land in the world.		
<b>continent</b>	a large area of land often separated from other continents by water.	 <p>We will continue to look at the different habitats in our local area. We will explore the different kinds of animals that you might find on a farm, in a pond, and under a log!</p>	<p>Frogs have been on Earth since the age of the dinosaurs.</p> 
<b>map</b>	a drawing of all or part of the world's surface.	 	<p>York is a city in England.</p> 
<b>land</b>	a part of the Earth's surface that is not covered by water.	<p>As part of our personal, social and emotional development, we will be learning how to control our emotions using a range of techniques. We will also practise our negotiation skills and learn how important it is to compromise!</p>	<p>All arachnids have 8 legs.</p>  
<b>ocean</b>	a huge area of saltwater that covers most of the Earth.
