This week, Year 5 and 6 took their learning about the circulatory system to the next level by carrying out pig heart dissections. The students explored the heart's structure in detail, gaining a deeper understanding of how blood circulates through the body. A huge thank you to Mrs. Aldridge, a parent at Dringhouses Primary, for leading these inspiring and hands-on sessions. Her expertise and passion for science brought the lesson to life! The dissections also tied perfectly with the children's current key text, Pig Heart Boy, which explores themes of medical science and the human heart, further enriching the students' learning experience. What a brilliant way to make science come alive!
